





10<sup>th</sup> Week Map







The deceased case was a 14 years old male. Lab sample was sent Jto Forensic lab, FSL Science lab, Madiwala, result awaited. District RRT investigated the outbreak. Dog bite contacts were reviewed and instructed to take Antirabies vaccine. Health education was given regarding wound management and importance of anti-rabies vaccination post exposure. |

District RRT investigated the outbreak. House to house survey was done. Most affected age group was 14 years and above. Symptomatic treatment was given. ORS sachets and halogen tablets distributed. Health education was given through community sensitization meeting on the importance of food hygiene, safe drinking water and sanitation.  |

The cases had symptoms of abdominal pain and loose stools. Both block and district RRT investigated the outbreak. One water sample collected and sent to KWA Kannur, result awaited. The possible source of outbreak was due to consumption of contaminated food in a temple feast. Apparently, there was a 4 hour gap between preparation and serving of food. All were given symptomatic treatment. ORS sachets were distributed. Health education was given by block health team through community sensitization meetings on the importance of food hygiene, safe drinking water and sanitation.   |

The possible source of outbreak was due to unhygienic measures in the Hostel Mess and surrounding area. All were given symptomatic treatment. ORS sachets were distributed. Strict instructions were given to shut down the mess as the food handlers did not have health cards and unhygienic storage of food. Health education was given by block health team through community sensitization meetings on the importance of food hygiene, safe drinking water and sanitation. |

They presented with fever and yellowish discolouration of eyes. The affected age group ranged from 2- 58 years. A total of 46 blood samples were collected and tested at RMRC, Bhubaneshwar. Of these, 26 samples were found positive for Hepatitis A by HAV IgM and two samples were positive for Hepatitis E by HEV IgM. Five water samples were sent to DPHL, Sundargarh and were found unsafe for drinking. District RRT investigated the outbreak. Health education was given through community sensitization meeting on the importance of food hygiene, safe drinking water and sanitation. |

#### DISEASE OUTBREAKS OF PREVIOUS WEEKS REPORTED LATE Case reported from Village Hirekasankandi, PHC/CHC Indragi, Taluk Koppal, District Koppal. Case presented with breathlessness and hydrophobia. He had a history of dog bite. He did not receive post exposure prophylaxis. The deceased Human Under case was a 22 years old male. Dog bite contacts were reviewed and instructed to take Anti-rabies vaccine. Health education was given regarding wound management and importance of anti-rabies vaccination post exposure. Case reported from Laitsohphie Pynursla block, East Khasi Hills District. The case presented with bite mark on the right leg along with symptoms of fever, headache, body ache, vomiting, hydrophobia and aerophobia. He did not receive Under Human post exposure prophylaxis. The deceased case was a ??. 01 **East Khasi Hills** 01 28/02/2023 MG/EKH/2023/10/212 Meghalaya Rabies Control District RRT investigated the outbreak. Dog bite contacts were reviewed and instructed to take Anti-rabies vaccine. Health education was given regarding wound management and importance of anti-rabies vaccination post exposure. Cases reported from Village Nichitpur Ward No 14, Uttar Dalkhola, and Municipality Uttar Dinajpur. They presented with fever with rashes. Five stool and one urine samples collected and result awaited. Cases were treated Under **Fever With** 21 00 29-12-22 symptomatically. Both district and block RRT investigated the **West Bengal Uttar Dinaipur** WB/WDN/2023/10/213 Rash Control outbreak. The affected age group was below 10 vears. Vitamin A supplementation was given to the affected cases. They were advised to get isolated. Health education given on

Cases were treated symptomatically. Both district and block RRT investigated the outbreak. The affected age group was below 10 years. They were advised to get isolated. Health education given on the importance of personal hygiene and sanitation. |
