


All admitted patients improved. Health camp organized by Bokaghat BPHC and health education given.

District RRT visited the North Lakhimpur Civil Hospital (NLCH). 3 stool samples collected from NLCH. Active search in the affected area to find new cases. Health awareness camp organized and health education given regarding prevention of food intoxication.

Cases are in the age-group of 12-18 years and of low socio-economic background. Symptomatic treatment provided to all cases. IEC activities done regarding prevention of chicken pox.
2.	Dilai	Gaya	iv. Chickenpox	14 / 0	26.03.11	04.04.11	Under control	Outbreak of fever and maculopapulovescicular rash, clinically diagnosed as chicken pox, reported from Village Nadiyainl, PHC Gurua. Cases are in age-group of 2.5-19 years. District RRT visited the affected area, treated cases symptomatically and undertook IEC activities regarding isolation of cases.

Viral Hepatitis	14 / 0	04.04.11	05.04.11	Under control	Cases of fever and jaundice reported from Ward no.10 & 11, Sheopur, probably due to consumption of contaminated water. All cases treated. Active survey done in the affected area to find new cases. Water samples sent for lab testing; result awaited. Health education given regarding hygiene and sanitation.

Chickenpox	37 / 0	31.03.11	31.03.11	Under surveillance	Outbreak of fever and rash, clinically diagnosed as Chicken pox reported from Village Doddapura (10 cases) and Doddamagge (27 cases), under PHCs Chikkadaluru and Arakalagudu, Taluka Hassan. All cases treated symptomatically. IEC activities undertaken regarding isolation of cases.

Health education given regarding hygiene and sanitation.

Fever survey and fogging done in the affected village. IEC activities undertaken regarding source reduction measures, early treatment of cases and personal protection measures.

All cases admitted in the CHC Polsara and all the cases were treated with antibiotics and anti-diarrhoeal drugs. ORS packets and halogens tablets distributed among the affected villagers. Chlorination of wells and tube wells done. Health education given to all affected household and other community people on personal hygiene measures.

Medical officer with his team visited and investigated outbreak in the affected area. Cases treated symptomatically. Vitamin-A supplementation given to all susceptible children in the affected village. Medical team instructed to cover all schools of the area for active surveillance and IEC activities regarding isolation and treatment of cases.

IEC activities undertaken regarding safe drinking water, hygienic practices and sanitation measures.

Health education given regarding personal hygiene and early treatment of cases.

Medical team advised people not to eat kuttu ka atta unless it is 'ISI' labeled and instructed the shopkeepers not to sell the same.

District RRT visited the affected area and investigated the outbreak. Cases admitted in Civil Hospital and Medical College, Faridkot for treatment. Samples of cooked and uncooked food taken by District Health Authorities for lab test; result awaited. All cooked food was destroyed. IEC activities undertaken regarding safe drinking water and safe food, hygienic practices and sanitation measures.
