

The villages are in hilly terrain area and bordering the state of Nagaland. People in these villages use untreated stream water which is likely to be contaminated upstream. All age group are equally affected. Medical team deployed from Maibong CHC. Water sample collected and tested by H2S test and MPN test showed fecal contamination. 2 out of 4 stool samples collected and sent to Microbiology Deptt. GMCH tested positive for Cholera. 108 emergency services are engaged for transportation of patients. IEC activities done. Active search is being done by paramedical staff for new cases.

Food material examined by food inspector. 2 stools samples collected and sent to DPL Golaghat tested negative. 2 water samples collected and tested by H2S strip on 04/06/12 were negative. Jail authority advised to provide boiled water to the prisoners. Health education given to all the prisoners in the jail.

Health education given, Chlorine tablet distribution done. Water being tested for residual chlorine.

House to house survey done for new cases and distribution of chlorine tablets done. Health education on personal & environmental hygiene given and repair of leakages in pipelines going on.

Chlorination of drinking water being done. Pipelines repaired. Health Education given to the community regarding drinking of boiled and chlorinated water.
