

32nd Week Map








District RRT investigated the outbreak and house to house survey was conducted. All cases were given symptomatic treatment. Four blood samples were sent for lab analysis. Of these, one was found positive for Measles by IgM ELISA. District RRT investigated the outbreak. Cases were isolated. Frequent changes of bedding and personal belongings, adequate diet and plenty of fluids were emphasized upon. Vitamin A Prophylaxis was given. Health education was imparted regarding importance of personal hygiene.

Cases presented with loose stools and abdominal pain. Seven water samples were sent for lab investigation at State Public Health Laboratory, Kharar. Of these, six samples were found non potable. District RRT investigated the outbreak. The outbreak was due to contamination of drinking water with sewage water pipeline. The deceased cases were a 2.5 years old female and a 5 years old male. House to house survey was conducted. All cases were given symptomatic treatment. ORS sachets, zinc tablets and halogen tablets were distributed. Super chlorination of water sources was done. Health education was given on the importance of safe drinking water and sanitation.

Cases presented with fever and bodyache. 11 blood samples were sent for lab analysis. Out of these, four samples were found positive for Dengue by NS1 antigen. District RRT investigated the outbreak. Survey of the area and fogging was done. Breeding sources were eliminated. Health education was given regarding the importance of vector control measures.

Cases presented with vomiting and loose stools after consumption of Fuchka (street food). Sixteen water, fourteen rectal swabs and sixteen stool samples were collected and sent to NICED. Out of all the rectal swabs and stool samples, eight samples were found positive for Salmonella enterica. District RRT investigated the outbreak and house to house survey was conducted. All cases were given symptomatic treatment. Health education was given on the importance of safe drinking water, food hygiene and sanitation.

Frequent changes of bedding and personal belongings, adequate diet and plenty of fluids were emphasized upon. Vitamin A Prophylaxis was given. Health education was imparted regarding importance of personal hygiene.

Cases presented with fever and rashes. Five blood and three oropharyngeal samples were sent for lab analysis to Guwahati Medical College and were found positive for Measles by IgM ELISA. District RRT investigated the outbreak. Vitamin A prophylaxis was given to all the suspected cases. All children were immunized with MCV. Health education was given.
