


ORS packets and chlorine tablets distributed in the locality. Health education given regarding hygiene and sanitation.
		Rajgarh	v. Acute Diarrhoeal Disease	216/0	31.08.10	03.09.10	Under control	Outbreak reported from Village Sultaniya, Block Sarangpur due to consumption of contaminated water of hand pump. Block Health Officer visited the affected area and investigated the outbreak. Water samples sent for lab testing; result awaited. Active surveillance done to find new cases. All cases treated. Alternate safe drinking water arranged. ORS packets and chlorine tablets distributed in the locality. Health education given regarding hygiene and sanitation.

1.	Assam	Dibrugarh	vi. Food poisoning	74 / 0	25.08.10	Under control	Outbreak reported from Village/SC Binogutia, Barbaruah PHC due to consumption of contaminated food (Prasad). All age groups were affected with the complaints of vomiting, pain abdomen and loose motion. Medical team from Barbaruah PHC visited the affected area and conducted active search in the affected area. Food samples not available for lab analysis. Health education given regarding food sanitation.			
2.	Jammu & Kashmir	Budgam	vii. Cholera	2229 / 3	16.08.10	Under control	Diarrhoeal outbreak first started in Waterhail (Khansahib Block) probably due to contamination of drinking water as a consequence of incessant rains which might have washed human/animal wastes from higher areas into the water sources. Subsequently four adjacent blocks (Beerwah, Khag, Budgam & Soibug) sharing the same contaminated water supply also got affected. 27 cases admitted for treatment in various centers. State RRT visited the affected area and investigated the outbreak. Mobile teams stationed in the affected areas for providing treatment at the doorstep. 31 water samples collected from the local water reservoirs and consumer points were analyzed in the Public Health Lab, Srinagar and found unfit for human consumption. Culture of collected stool samples & rectal swabs grew mixed isolates of Shigella and Vibrio. Of the 280 patients admitted in SK Institute of Medical Sciences, 26 samples tested positive for <i>V. cholerae O1 El tor (Ogawa)</i> . Death occurred among those who reported to health institutions in a state of irreversible shock. Cases treated with antibiotics and rehydration fluids. Health education given regarding safe drinking water, personal and environmental hygiene, and food safety.

Vitamin-A supplementation given to all susceptible children in the affected village. IEC activities undertaken regarding providing proper nutrition and early treatment of cases.			
		Shahdol	ix. Acute Diarrhoeal Disease	9/3	23.08.10	Under control	Cases reported from Village Kharia, Block Beohari due to consumption of contaminated water. House to house search done to find new cases. All cases treated. ORS packets and chlorine tablets distributed in the locality. IEC activities undertaken regarding safe drinking water, hygienic practices and sanitation measures.

4.	Orissa	Rayagada	xii. Cholera	784 / 39*	06.08.10	Under surveillance	Outbreak of diarrhoea occurred in many adjacent blocks of Rayagada district; the worst affected blocks are Kashipur, Bissamcuttack, Kalyansingpur, Jemadeipentho (Rayagada) and Jagannathpur (Gunupur). The State RRT members including SSO visited the affected areas and investigated the outbreak. All deaths have occurred in the remote and inaccessible areas. Out of 20 clinical samples collected from various blocks and sent for lab investigation to RMRC Bhubaneswar, 8 samples were positive for <i>V. cholerae O1 (Ogawa)</i> . Control measures undertaken by the State officials included setting up a control room at the DSU and health-camps at the villages, treatment of all cases with antibiotics, active surveillance by medical teams to cover all villages, pot-chlorination of drinking-water and extensive IEC activities in the area. Situation is being monitored by the CDMO, Rayagada

IEC activities undertaken regarding safe drinking water, hygienic practices and sanitation measures.
