







To learn how to use antibiotics, one must first learn when not to use antibiotics



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Protect yourself, your patients and your family from antibiotic resistance



A missed hand hygiene opportunity can have consequences for those in your care



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Antibiotics are only needed to treat infections caused by bacteria, not viruses

Only prescribe antibiotics when they are clinically indicated



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Patients can get infected while receiving healthcare - called 'Healthcare-associated infections' (HAIs)

HAIs are commonly caused by antibioticresistant bacteria, which are difficult to treat

Lets pledge to take all appropriate actions to protect patients from antibiotic-resistant infections









Tell your patients why they don't need antibiotics for a viral infection, what to do to feel better and when to seek care again if they don't feel better

Prevent Infections

- Ensure patients receive recommended vaccines
- · Alert receiving facilities when transferring patients with antibiotic-resistant infections
- · Educate patients on ways to prevent spread
- · Stay informed of current outbreaks



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Be Alert & Take Action

Be aware of infections and resistance patterns in your healthcare facility and community

Ensure you are notified by the laboratory immediately when antibiotic-resistant pathogens are identified in your patients

Inform patients and families if they have an antibiotic-resistant infection and educate them how to prevent its spread



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Prevent and control the spread of antibiotic resistance

- Prevent infections by ensuring hands, instruments, and environment are clean
- Only prescribe and dispense antibiotics when they are needed, according to current guidelines
- Report antibiotic-resistant infections to surveillance teams
- Talk to patients about how to take antibiotics correctly, antibiotic resistance and the dangers of misuse
- · Talk to patients about preventing infections
